


Thomas Barrow, Man Out of Time



1. Julian Fellowes. "Episode One." *Downton Abbey*. Dir. Brian Percival. 26 September 2010. Television.

April 1912: It is revealed that the Duke once had a romantic relationship with Thomas, the footman.

2. Julian Fellowes. "Episode Three." *Downton Abbey*. Dir. Ben Bolt. 10 October 2010. Television.

March 1913: To her surprise, Mary is instantly attracted to Kemal Pamuk, an attaché at the Turkish Embassy, and the feeling is reciprocated. When Thomas makes an ill-judged pass at Pamuk, Pamuk forces him to take him to Mary's room later that night.

3. Julian Fellowes. "Episode Two." *Downton Abbey*. Dir. Ashley Pearce. 25 September 2011. Television.

April 1917: Thomas returns from the war and begins work in the local hospital. Thomas becomes attached to patient Edward Courtenay, who is suffering from blindness. Thomas is left devastated when Edward dies by suicide.

July 1920: After being misleadingly encouraged by O'Brien, Thomas makes a midnight visit to Jimmy's room and kisses him as he sleeps—just as Alfred enters the room. Jimmy is outraged and disgusted. So is Alfred.

5. Julian Fellowes. "Episode Eight." *Downton Abbey*. Dir. David Evans. 4 November 2012. Television.

Before 11 August 1920: Downton Abbey's annual cricket match with the village takes place. Alfred complains about Thomas to the police. When officers arrive to see him, Lord Grantham persuades the police that it was all a misunderstanding.

August 1921: At the country fair, Jimmy is nearly robbed after winning money from betting on the tug of war, but is saved by Thomas, who was following him and is robbed and beaten in his place. They later agree just to be friends.


April 1924: Jimmy is fired for going to bed with a Lady houseguest. Jimmy tells Thomas that he has been a good friend, and that he is sorry he put him through so much.

1924: Baxter takes Thomas to Dr Clarkson, and he admits he was attempting to "cure" his homosexuality.

Between 22 July - 29 August, 1925: Thomas attempts to take his own life.

1927: The film is the continued story of the Crawley family, wealthy owners of a large estate in the English countryside in the early 20th century. The film is set in 1927, when King George V and Queen Mary visit Downton Abbey, causing quite a stir of uneasiness and tension among the Crawleys and Servants alike.

Timeline, contemporaneous with the show




*Rob James-Collier was 34 (not 16) when Downton premiered. Gives you some additional perspective on his morose dickishness.


Timeline, well before the show...

The state of British sexual politics with regard to homosexuality




